Dear Miss Fankhurst,

I am afraid that I shall not be able to be of much help to you, for I am not in touch with the Italian colony in London, and I cannot think of anyone who would be able to give hospitality to a refugee. I feel, indeed, that without knowing more about him, his name, trade or profession, the reasons why he is in prison, he will be difficult to find anyone, even English people, who would give a definite promise in that sense. What is essential is that he should be able to give some sort of reference.

I am very sorry not to be able to be more helpful.
