Dear Comrade Nenni,

On receiving your letter, I at once telephoned to the promoters of the meeting and told them what you had said. I also received a letter from Mr. Gillies of the Labour Party, and I told them of his letter. They replied that Mr. Bridgeman, who is supposed to be representing the League against Imperialism, and is to take the chair at the meeting (he is one of the Communists, of course) had been to Paris and come back with the news that you were positively coming. I felt some doubt that this could be so after your letter, and rang them up again today, when I learned that you had sent a telegram that you could not come, but sent your good wishes to the meeting, and those of a Committee formed in Paris against the war with Abyssinia. I should be glad to know whether you sent such a telegram, and what this Committee is. Please let me know exactly how the matter stands.
